

*Parliamentary Procedure CDE
Guidelines for 2006*

Five motions will be selected from the following list:

- Previous Question
- Division of a Question
- Recess
- Suspend the Rules
- Parliamentary Inquiry
- Postpone definitely
- Point of Order
- Limit or Extend Debate
- Main Motion
- Call for the orders of the Day
- Adjourn
- Object to the consideration of a question

Additional abilities (other than those listed above) may be used to score points for the discussion category.

The motion in which the abilities must be demonstrated will be taken from one of the following Topics:

- FFA Membership Recruitment
- FFA Camp participation
- SC FFA State Convention
- National FFA Convention
- Scholarship Program

Minutes will not be taken at the Region or State Level.

A two-minute huddle will be allowed once the team comes on stage and the abilities are given.

Each contestant will be asked **one oral question** from each judge based upon the abilities presented.

At the state level, a written test will also be included. Sample tests are provided on-line at www.SCAgEd.org

District Level Competition

Each chapter is encouraged to enter one team in the Region competition.

State Competition

Each Region is permitted to enter two teams in the state competition. If a Region holds a federation level competitions, it is the respective Regional coordinator's responsibility to notify the state of the two teams that will represent their Region.

CONTEST PROCEDURES

Each team will consist of six team members.

The team will select the chair.

The team will be provided with a motion to be presented during the demonstration.

Each team member – excluding the chair, will be assigned a contestant number and issued a procedure to be demonstrated during the demonstration. The procedure must be conducted along with the **assigned** motion.

After assignments are made, the team will be given two minutes to “huddle”.

The team must conduct a demonstration in the form of a meeting. The demonstration should last no more than 10 minutes.

During the demonstration, the team may use more than one main motion as long as it pertains to the assigned main motion.

At the conclusion of the demonstration, each contestant will be asked one question pertaining to his or her demonstration.
