What is the Envirothon?

The Envirothon is North America's largest high school environmental competition. It is a hands-on outdoor competition geared for teaching 9-12th grade students about the environment and natural resources. Teams of between 3 and 5 students are tested on their knowledge of aquatics, forestry, soils, wildlife, a current environmental issue and an oral presentation. The topic for the 2007 competition is Alternative/Renewable Energy.

What the Envirothon Does...

The Envirothon builds awareness. It is designed to help the leaders of tomorrow learn both sides of environmental issues so that they can make informed decisions. Concepts such as renewable versus non-renewable resources are stressed, as are the interdependence and interaction of ecosystems. The learning objectives outlined for each study area meet numerous state curriculum standards in Science, Social Studies, Economics and English.

How to get Involved...

If you are a teacher, scout troupe or environmental club leader with students that are interested in participating, you can contact your local Soil and Water Conservation District for additional information about the program. Districts can be found in the phone book under county government, or you can reference the list on the back panel of this brochure. Many districts of the state will sponsor Envirothon teams at the \$100 registration level.

All team leaders, or coaches, are invited to attend a free one-day training held in February each year. This training will prepare coaches with some of the materials needed to teach the team members what will be covered on the exams at the competition. Coaches are not required to register a team prior to the training, so if you are merely looking for more information before committing, you can attend and decide afterwards.

The training provided will be mainly hands-on and will include tree and soil identification. The training, just like the competition, will be held rain or shine. Additional information will be provided on urban conservation and low impact development which will become useful when tying together the oral presentation.
