Purpose:

General Rules and Regulations:

2. Contest open to all Young Farmer members in good standing with the South Carolina Young Farmer and Agribusiness Association.
3. Each Young Farmer competing in the contest must submit the completed application form along with supporting evidence to the SCYFAA State Office before December 1. If additional space is required, refer to and attach to application.
4. A winner of any award is only eligible to receive a higher award in the future.
5. The basis of judging participants is on a point system as indicated in the application form to determine the highest scoring individuals.
6. The Young Farmer State Executive Committee and an NRCS representative will select the state winners.
